CARRIAGE OF FIREARMS AND AMMUNITION

The attached declaration must be completed for intended travel with carriage of firearms and ammunition on board Spirit of Tasmania I and Spirit of Tasmania II.

In accordance with the Maritime Transport and Offshore Facility Security Act 2003, it is a serious offence for any unauthorised person to have in his or her possession any type of firearm or prohibited weapon when proceeding through a screening point within a Port Facility or whilst in a Maritime Security Zone. Penalties of up to seven years imprisonment can apply on conviction.

(Maritime Security Guards are exempt under this legislation and have approval to handle firearms)

All firearms / ammunition must be surrendered to TT-Line Company Pty Ltd (TT-Line) on arrival and carried in TT-Line provided gun safes. Passengers with firearms are requested to check in at the TT-Line Terminal two hours prior to departure time to allow sufficient time for processing. All firearms will be surrendered at the screening point prior to boarding and loaded into the safe by passengers at their own risk.

All firearms / ammunition will be collected from Port Security Officers on arrival and disembarkation at the destination port.

REQUIREMENTS:

All Firearms are to be surrendered to Shore Security Officers for storage by owners prior to the voyage, as per clause 30(a) (i) and (b) (i) of the *Terms & Conditions of Carriage*.

1. Firearms must be unloaded and securely stowed in approved containers (leather bag, gun case or similar) with bolts and magazines removed.
2. Ammunition must be kept in a robust or solid container suitable for the purpose of travel and submitted to a Security Officer for storage prior to the voyage.
3. Ammunition will be transported separately in a locked container with the passenger name on the box.
4. Firearms and ammunition must be stored separately in locked containers.
5. If possible, firearms fitted with a safety lock must be locked.
6. Gun Powder cannot be carried.
7. Firearms are to be collected from Shore Security Officers on arrival after disembarkation.
8. Photo identification and baggage claim ticket stub must be shown to Port Security Officers to collect firearms and ammunition in the arriving port.
