

GUIDELINES OF EXPECTED BEHAVIOUR

FOR THE ATTENTION OF TEACHERS AND/OR GUARDIANS

The following guidelines of expected behaviour must be observed by all passengers on Spirit of Tasmania. They are required for your safety and the safety of fellow passengers. Please ensure all members of your group are made aware of these guidelines. If you require any further information or clarification of any of the information, please contact our Group Department on 1800 635 877. We wish you a pleasant journey onboard Spirit of Tasmania.

1. Strictly no running at any time whilst onboard, it is a danger to yourself and your fellow passengers.
2. Noisy behaviour in cabins, corridors and public areas is not acceptable. Please do not congregate in the corridors. Unruly or noisy behaviour and obscene or abusive language, or rudeness, is not acceptable.
3. As a matter of safety and courtesy for all passengers on board, females and males are required to meet the following minimum standards. Footwear must be worn at all times in all public areas on board the ship and terminal areas. Clothing to be worn on both upper and lower body (t-shirt/singlet and shorts minimum). If these minimum requirements are not met, individuals will be asked to confirm or may be refused passage.
4. Once onboard the Group Leader needs to attend Reception on Deck 7 to nominate an appropriate curfew time and to arrange for the morning inspection of cabins prior to disembarkation.
5. Whilst in cabins, please keep them tidy and use the waste bins provided.
6. Shut the bathroom door whilst showering as heat from the shower can activate the Cabin Fire System. An inspection of each cabin will be held by Ship's staff.
7. All internal areas of the ship are non-smoking, including the cabins. Smoke detectors are fitted in all cabins.
8. Students/Passengers must only use Deck 7, 8, 9 and 10. It is an offence under the Maritime Security Act (2003) for any person, other than crew members, to be found in areas that are clearly marked as being restricted areas.
9. It is an offence under Commonwealth Navigation Act (1912) for anyone to tamper, damage or interfere with any Ships Lifesaving Gear or Equipment — Penalty \$2000 or 6 months in Prison (Remember the lifejacket you interfere with may be needed by others if an emergency occurs). It is also an offence to throw anything over the ship's side.
10. Passengers are advised that all luggage including overnight bags will be subject to security inspection at check-in.
11. Additional cabins keys will only be issued at the request of the Teacher/Guardian. Additional cabin keys will not be issued to students.
12. We request that only the Group Leader approaches the Terminal Service Desk at the Terminal to collect the group's boarding passes and cabin keys. The Group Leader is to inform the check-in staff of any amendments to the group travelling. If there is an amendment the Group Leader will be asked to sign a Group Amendment Form stating the amendments are true and correct.
13. Onboard Security will page your group shortly after boarding and request your attendance on Deck 10 for a brief behaviour guidelines overview. This is to assist both the Teachers and our Crew to ensure all students have a thorough understanding of the behaviour expected whilst travelling onboard.
14. For a meeting place prior to disembarkation, we recommend assembling on Deck 7 stern/aft of TMK (Tasmanian Market Kitchen).
